- n late October, eighty land managers. public agencies, researchers, elected of-I ficials, and community members, gathered at SBALT's Nyland property for the Pajaro Compass Network Fall Stakeholder Meeting. The Pajaro Compass was develoned in 2015 to bring together people who share an interest in the Pajaro River watershed, to learn, connect, and engage in efforts to maintain the health and productivity of the region. Participants sat on straw bales while listening to presentations for the first hour, and then the group walked to the lower reservoir for presentations on the animals and plants that live on the ranch, the Amah Mutsun Land Trust's plans under their cultural easement, and the structure of the acquisition of this keystone property.
